Exceptional Journalism Honored in 2016 College Better Newspaper Contest

Members of the Hoosier Press Association reviewed 625 entries submitted by 13 Michigan college newspapers this year and selected three college newspapers for creating great journalism.

The 2016 "College Newspaper of the Year" award is presented to the top college newspapers in three divisions based on points accumulated (100 for first, 70 for second and 40 for third) in all editorial contest categories (categories 1-12). Winners of those awards are:
