Exceptional Journalism Honored in 2017 College Better Newspaper Contest

Members of the Hoosier Press Association reviewed 816 entries submitted by 16 Michigan college newspapers this year and selected three college newspapers for creating great journalism.

The 2017 "College Newspaper of the Year" award is presented to the top college newspapers in three divisions based on points accumulated (100 for first, 70 for second and 40 for third) in all editorial contest categories (categories 1-12). Winners of those awards are:

The election campaign was covered by several campus papers, but a variety of issues closer to campus were also topics of the 31 entries. The Collegian earned first place for its professional-level coverage of election night, including national results, Michigan races involving alumni, reactions of students and faculty, all against tight deadlines to get the paper printed and back on campus the next morning. The Valley Vanguard also dealt with tight deadlines when it covered the shooting of five people at a huge (1,000 people) party across the street from campus. The paper had its on-line report posted the next morning, and the print edition on campus a day later.
