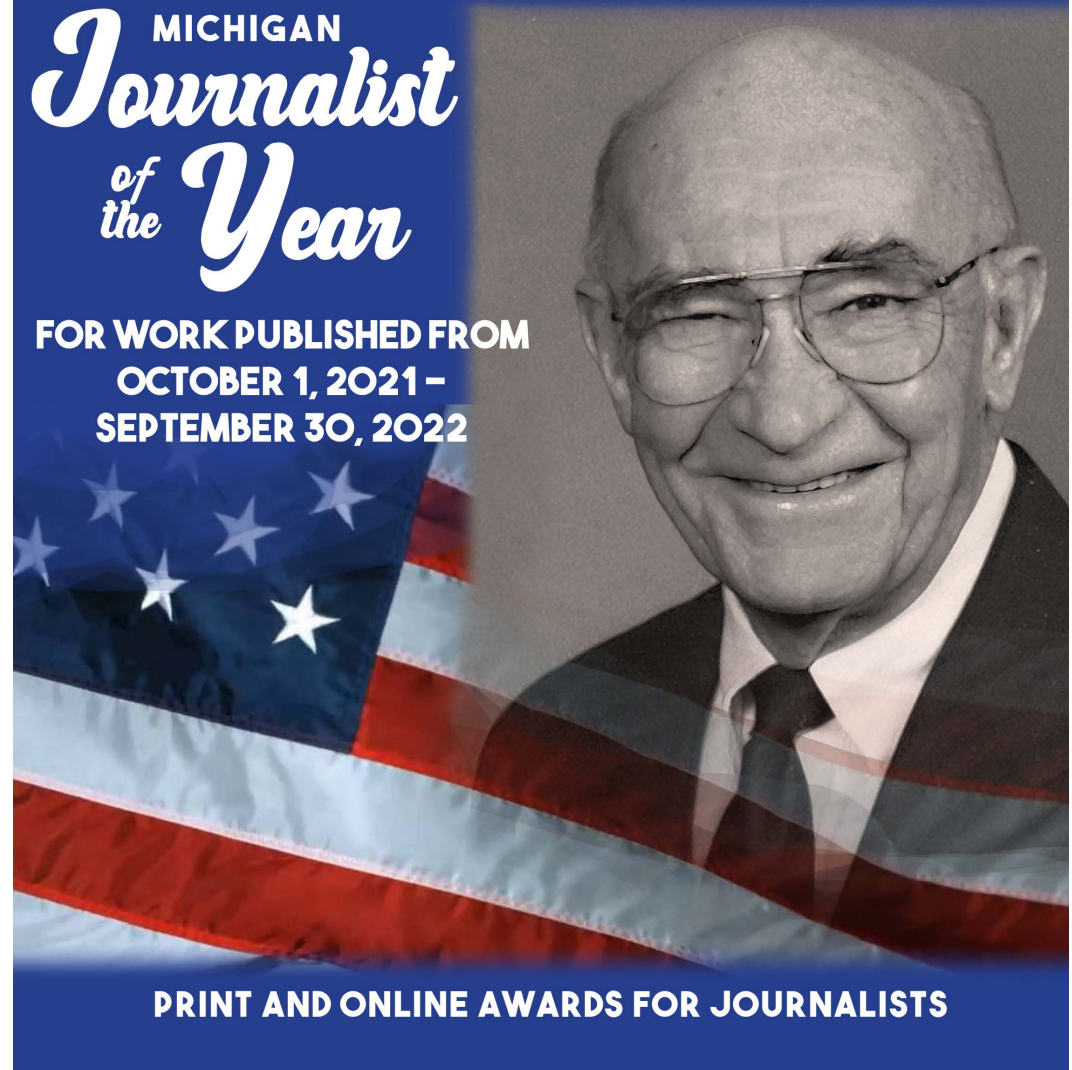
About the Michigan Press Association Foundation

Richard Milliman: A Proud Legacy

Richard Milliman was inducted into the Michigan Journalism Hall of Fame in 1994 following a career that spanned more than 60 years in state newspapers.

He was a reporter, writer, editor, manager or owner and publisher at more than 40 Michigan newspapers. In 1980, Milliman was a leader in establishing the Michigan Press Association Foundation to promote, protect and encourage journalism in Michigan.

The Richard Milliman Michigan Journalist of the Year award is an annual competition sponsored by the Michigan Press Association Foundation. In 2016, the Michigan Journalist of the Year award was renamed in honor of Richard Milliman, a MPA Foundation founder and long term supporter and advocate of press in Michigan.

Entries may come from news outlets, individual journalist or others acting on their behalf. Entries will be judged by a panel representative of journalism professionals, educators and members of the Foundation board.

Entries will be accepted beginning August 1, 2022.

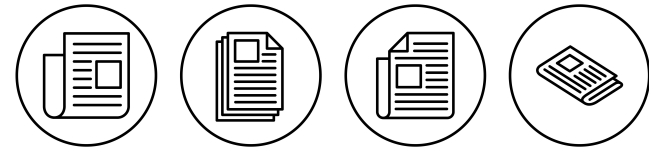
The submission must include a cover letter and work from October 1, 2021-September 30, 2022.

If you already have an open call account from a previous year or if you have entered other open call contests here are the steps to add the 2022 Michigan Journalist of the Year contest to My Contests:

1. Once you login go to Open Call
2. Contests Click on My Contests

3. Find 2022 Michigan Journalist of the Year contest under available contests and click in the check box. Once you click it, the contest will move up to Pending Contests and you will then be approved by the contest admin

While waiting to be approved for the contest, you can go to Manage Entries and start your contest entry.



The deadline for entries is Oct. 30, 2022.

The winner will be announced in 2023.

The Richard Milliman JOY Award honors journalism that has a significant impact on our state or local community. Former winners include:

2020 *Michael Wilkinson of Bridge Michigan* for his reporting on Covid

2019 *Tresa Baldas of The Detroit Free Press* for her coverage of sexual assaults at Jamaican resorts.

2018 *Paula Gardner of MLive* for her reporting on PFAS.

2017 *Garrett Ellison of MLive* for his watchdog reporting, including his coverage of Nestle water

2016 *Karen Bouffard & Joel Kurth of the Detroit News* for revealing a decade-long problems of cleaning surgical instruments at one of Michigan's biggest hospital systems.

2015 *Curt Guyette of ACLU* for his reporting of the Flint Water Story.

2014 *Jennifer Dixon of the Detroit Free Press* for her investigative reporting into the lack of transparency on how \$1 billion of taxpayer funds are spent on charter schools in Michigan.
